Water heater should be set at 120 degrees or less Watch for burn risks: stoves, space heaters, irons, fireplace Always supervise around open water/bathtubs 	 Breast/formula recommended until age 1 Baby needs 15-20 ounces of breast milk or formula daily for bone growth (4-5 oz every 3-4 hours) Always hold your baby during feedings Pumped breast milk can be given by bottle occasionally to give baby another way to drink and others to enjoy bonding NO juices Avoid using bottle as pacifier, only use bottle when hungry Clean teeth/gums twice a day with soft cloth Never put baby to bed with a bottle Read daily, sing & be active! No toys or blankets in the crib Home & Personal Safety Safety latches on cabinets and doors is important, assess with survey on your knees Keep cords, strings, hanging mobiles away Children require a tobacco free environment Keep baby out of the direct sun Properly fitted & installed, rear-facing car seat! Poison Control number available to all caregivers
